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There is a critical need for wastewater infrastructure in southern Hamilton. But Hamiltonians and neighboring communities deserve a fair, transparent process for choosing its location. Council has effectively made this decision without community visibility and without genuine consultation, undermining trust and leaving residents in the dark.

With an expected cost of \$500 million, we can not afford a project of this magnitude to over-run the budget. It has already started badly, due to a lack of proper and genuine consultation, so the likelihood of budget blow-out is already extremely high. This is exactly the type of project we, as prospective councillors, want to oversee.

Both the site selection process for the proposed Southern Wastewater Treatment Plant and the expected impact on the local community are concerning to us as candidates for Hamilton City Council.

We will push for a transparent site selection process, using clear criteria such as distance from housing, environmental impact, and long-term value for ratepayers. The current proposal should be paused until alternatives are properly assessed and residents have been heard.

This is about more than one plant. It's about changing the culture of Council, ending token consultation and ensuring major projects are decided openly, with the community, not behind closed doors.
